

**Thursday, July 10**

**Boys Scholastic**

**Wentworth Institute of Technology – Boston, MA**

**West 13, Metro 7**

West dominated throughout the game after building a 3-1 lead in the first quarter. West's Ben Flagg (Westfield HS) led all scorers with three goals, while teammates Jonah Bass (Amherst HS), Even Raser (St Joseph's HS) and Chris Warton (Northampton) added two goals apiece.
